

Chairman Bart Muller called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Those present were Commissioners Muller, Earl Haringa, Matt Scott and Tom Lindquist; Chief Aaron Mundello; Assistant Chief Craig Lundquist; Captain Jose Ramirez; and Board Clerk Lisa Wynn.

Scott led the flag salute.

The minutes of the January meeting were approved as presented.

Chief Mundello reported that:

- The roster stands at 29 with one firefighter on a leave of absence and three applicants being considered
- Candidates are being considered for one open captain's position
- Modesto, Stanislaus and Turlock are considering entering into an Auto-Aid Agreement with Denair Fire
- Stanislaus County OES is continuing to implement First Due, an emergency management system

Check #4341809473 dated January 2, 2026 for \$448.00 was received from AMR Holdco, Inc. for November, 2025 service reimbursement. Check #991056225 dated January 16, 2026 for \$1,178.40 was received from Stanislaus County for reimbursement of the Active911 membership fees..

Scott/Lindquist moved to pay the bills (schedule attached). Motion carried.

There were 63 fire calls in January with the breakdown as follows: 34 EMS; 7 fire alarms; 3 injury traffic collisions; 6 mutual aids; 3 other; 2 other fires; 4 public assists; 1 smoke check; 2 structure fires and 1 wires down.

The commissioners and fire chief filled out Form 700.

Haringa moved that \$185,000.00 be transferred from the General Fund to the Oak Valley Checking and that \$1,801.18 be transferred from the Special Assessment Fund to the General Fund to cover the cost of the swift water rescue equipment. Scott seconded the motion and the motion carried.

Quotes are being obtained to install a backflow device at the station as required by the Community Services District.

Quotes are being obtain to purchase Mobile Data Computers and service as required by Stanislaus County.

Ninety people attended the County dinner hosted by the department on January 15.

The Volunteer Association purchased four stabilization struts for the district.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:42 p.m.
